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## Aims and Scope

APJD is the official journal of the Japanese Dental Science Federation (JDSF) and the Japanese Academy of Dental Technology (JADT). The journal publishes original articles, review articles, short communications, case reports, technical articles, and others. APJD is a peer-reviewed and open-access journal registered in the Japan Science and Technology Information Aggregator, Electronic (J-STAGE).

The journal accepts articles related to prosthodontics, dental material science, dental technology, restorative dentistry, endodontics, periodontics, orthodontics, pedodontics, oral and maxillofacial surgery, oral implantology, oral radiology, dental anesthesiology, dental public health, preventive dentistry, social dentistry, basic oral sciences, and clinical oral sciences. All articles are peer reviewed by recognized subject experts. The journal is published twice yearly (May and November) with advance publication.

- Submission of a manuscript indicates a tacit understanding that the article is not actively under consideration for publication with another journal.
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### Article Category

- This journal features the following categories, original articles, review articles, short communications, case reports, technical articles, and others.

### Original Article

**Abstract:** limit to 250 words

- The Abstract must be structured with the subsections: Purpose, Method(s), Result(s), and Conclusion(s).
- Presentation of multiple trade names is not recommended in the Abstract section. They should be reported with generic terms.
- Terms should not be abbreviated unless they are repeatedly or commonly used. Present the word in full initially, followed by the abbreviation in parentheses. The authors can present thereafter the abbreviation only.

### Introduction:

- Include problem, previous studies, literature review, objective of the study, and hypothesis.

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### **Materials and Methods:**

- Manufacturing information should be presented in this section or in a table with generic term, trade name, lot number, manufacturer, city location, ANSI States code if in the USA, and country.
- As for material-related research, materials or reagents employed should be summarized in a table together with ingredients, composition, lot number, and manufacturer.
- City location and country of the manufacturer should appear once and not be repeated.
- Unit: Use of SI units is required.
- Sample size and evidence of sample size determination should be reported in this section.
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Application of parametric or non-parametric analysis should be determined after analysis of normality and homoscedasticity.
- If AI was used for data collection, analysis, or figure generation, authors should describe this use in the Materials and Methods section.
- Clinical trial registration  
Clinical trial registration numbers should be reported, if applicable.
- Refer to the following research reporting standards.  
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- Report the experimental results in the text, table or in the figure.
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### **Discussion:**

- Subheadings should not be used in the Discussion section.
- Provide clinical significance in this section based on the results of the study.
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- Description of conclusion must be pertinent to the purpose and justified by the data.

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**Number of authors:** Limit to six (6) or less.

**Abstract:** Limit to 100 words, unstructured, and single paragraph.

**Text:** Limit to 2,000 words including abstract and legends.

The name of the IRB and approval code/reference number must be provided in the Ethical Statements section.
